

## 25. Completion (Graduation) Rates

### Graduation Rates for Kenrick-Glennon School of Theology

Data are collected on the number of students entering the institution as full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students in a particular year (cohort); the number completing their program within 150 percent of normal time to completion; and the resulting percentage is calculated.

Kenrick-Glennon Seminary does not disclose disaggregated rates (rates separated according to gender, race, or recipients of federal aid) because its numbers are so small. This is in accordance with the text on p. A-23 of the Report of the National Postsecondary Education Cooperative, *Information Required to Be Disclosed Under the Higher Education Act of 1965: Suggestions for Dissemination*: “Disaggregated rates are to be disclosed only if the number of students in each group is sufficient to yield statistically reliable information and not reveal personally identifiable information about an individual student.”
