

26. Placement in Employment

“Institutions must make available to current and prospective students information regarding the placement in employment of, and types of employment obtained by, graduates of the institution's degree or certificate programs” (p. A-26, Report of the National Postsecondary Education Cooperative, *Information Required to Be Disclosed Under the Higher Education Act of 1965: Suggestions for Dissemination*).

All students at Cardinal Glennon College are seminarians who are studying for ordination to the priesthood. To be ordained a priest, they must have a Master's in Divinity or in Theology from a Catholic seminary. Therefore most graduates from CGC do not seek employment, but are enrolled by their bishop in a graduate program of that kind.

Almost all seminarians who graduate from Kenrick-Glennon School of Theology are ordained to the priesthood and continue to work as a priest. These rates are as follows:
