Personal Formation Agreement

Instructions:

Seminarians are accountable for all aspects of priestly formation within the parameters of the external forum. This includes participation in spiritual exercises, the spiritual direction program, liturgical exercises, and community life as well as the intellectual and pastoral dimensions of formation. (*Program of Priestly Formation*, 5th ed., #275)

<u>Personal Formation Agreement</u>. At the beginning of the year, each seminarian will prepare a Personal Formation Agreement in consultation with his Formation Advisor. He should take account of his previous year's evaluation, if applicable. He will consult the attached list of evaluation criteria specified by the *Program of Priestly Formation*. These are the same criteria which form the basis of faculty, peer and formal evaluations of each seminarian.

Normally, in consultation with his Formation Advisor, each seminarian will describe one or two goals from each of the four dimensions of formation based upon the evaluation criteria from the *Program of Priestly Formation* #280. If applicable, please consult your formal evaluation reports from last year for the specification of your goals for this year. The <u>total</u> number of goals should be in the five-to-seven range, with eight being the maximum, unless the Formation Advisor approves more.

EACH GOAL should be as specific as possible. For example, in the area of Human Formation, one might wish to address this issue: "The capacity to relate to others in a positive manner and the ability to get along with others and work with them in the community." The seminarian could specify this goal by stating that he will work to overcome a negative impression that others have formed.

The next step in the contract would be to specify the MEANS FOR ACHIEVING THE GOAL. For the goal stated above, one could specify the means by saying that he will ask for feedback from his peers on a weekly basis. In order to identify the means of achieving the goal, it will usually be helpful to ask how one will measure the results for himself. In other words, how will he know if he has succeeded or failed?

Once one has specified the goals and the means of achieving those goals, his Formation Advisor reviews the agreement. If the Formation Advisor approves, both sign the agreement. Then, **the original is given to the Dean of Seminarians**. *Copies of the signed original should be provided by the seminarian to his Formation Advisor and Spiritual Director*.

Completed agreements are due on or before September 29, 2017.

Spiritual Formation:

There should be accountability in the external forum for seminarians' participation in spiritual exercises of the seminary and their growth as men of faith. Within the parameters of the external forum, habits of prayer and personal piety are also areas of accountability.

- 2. Abiding love for the sacramental life of the Church, especially the Holy Eucharist and Penance;
- 3. A loving knowledge of the Word of God and prayerful familiarity with that Word;
- 4. Appreciation of and commitment to the Liturgy of the Hours;
- 5. Fidelity to the liturgical and spiritual program of the seminary, including the daily celebration of the Eucharist
- 6. Fidelity to regular spiritual direction and regular celebration of the Sacrament of Penance;
- 7. A positive embrace of a lifelong commitment to chaste celibacy, obedience, and simplicity of life;
- 8. A love for Jesus Christ and the Church, for the Blessed Virgin Mary and the saints; and
- 9. A spirit of self-giving charity toward others.
