1.	Thesis Statement	
	A thesis statement declares, in one sentence, a specific goal or goals of the paper. (Remember that the STB paper is meant to be synthetic in nature. It synthesizes several areas rather than focusing on one, and synthesizes theology and experience/application.)	
2.	Rationale	
	The rationale expresses the significance or importance of the question. E.g.: Why does this matter theologically? Why does it matter in the life of a priest? Why does it matter in the life of the Church? Etc.	
3.	Methodology Statement	
	The methodology statement provides an explanation of <i>how</i> the synthesis will be developed and articulated. (For example, a student writing on the Eucharist from the discipline of sacramental theology would most likely employ a different methodology than a student writing on the same topic from biblical theology.)	
4.	Tentative Outline	
	The outline articulates the topics that will appear within the paper. The outline is to be developed sufficiently to demonstrate a basic grasp of the areas the student proposes to synthesize in the paper.	
5.	Annotated Bibliography	
	The bibliography describes three to five primary and secondary sources relevant to the topic the student chooses. Some indication of how each source affects the paper should be made.
